PURPOSE

Founded in 1988, Good Works Inc. is a faith-based nonprofit organization headquartered in Coatesville, PA. From our warehouse sites in Coatesville, Exton, Phoenixville and St. Peters Village, we now serve 49 municipalities in Chester County. We transform substandard houses into warmer, safer, drier and healthier homes, and despair into hope. Our services are offered to homeowners at no cost and volunteers do most of the repairs. Our goal is to see the families living in these homes rise above poverty and experience a richer, fuller life as they are cared for and reminded that their circumstances matter to our community and to God. We believe that everyone benefits when people from different races, cultures and backgrounds join together with a common purpose – repairing homes and restoring hope.

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



“Well done, good and faithful servant.” These words come from a parable told by Jesus where a master entrusts resources to his servants and later returns to see what they have done with what they were given. I encourage you to set down this Annual Impact Report for a moment, open your Bible to Matthew 25: 14-30 and read it prayerfully. This parable has been interpreted many ways, but you need to realize that when Jesus uses the term “talents,” He is not referring to God-given skills

and abilities as we often define the word, nor is He actually referring to a measure of currency. Instead, he is pointing to a greater truth. This is a parable about faith and faith is a gift from God (Romans 12:3). The parable reminds us of something profound: the master was not impressed by comparison or scale. One servant handled five talents, another two. Yet both heard the exact same words: “Well done, good and faithful servant.” Later in the story, a third servant “buried” the faith offered to him and he was ultimately punished for squandering this great gift. It is by faith that we are saved and it is by faith that we do good works.

Faithful service is what we experience every day at Good Works. It is rarely glamorous. More often, it looks like ordinary people responding faithfully to the opportunities God places before them. In 2025, that faithfulness was expressed through thousands of acts of compassion and repair which helped make homes warm, safe, dry, and healthy for our neighbors.

Thank you for being part of this work. Whether your contribution seemed large or small, Scripture reminds us that God values faithfulness above all else. May everything reflected in these pages point ultimately to Him, and may we continue together in faithful service until the day we hear:

“Well done, good and faithful servant.”

PHYSICAL Transformation

At 75 years old, Jeannette carries tremendous responsibility each day. Living with a chronic health condition while raising her three grandchildren, she faces life's challenges with quiet strength and unwavering determination. But the home she worked so hard to maintain was falling into disrepair. The windows were failing. The front porch had become unsafe. Basement flooding threatened the structure of the house, and a deteriorating addition on the back of the home had become hazardous and unusable. Poorly built and exposed to the elements, the space had become a refuge for bees and squirrels rather than a safe living area for her family.

Unable to afford the extensive repairs on her own, Jeannette reached out to Good Works for help.

Following a full home inspection, volunteers uncovered even more urgent needs to make the house warm, safe, dry, and healthy. Because of Jeannette's age and health concerns, Good Works made the decision not only to repair the failing addition, but to completely transform it into a new first-floor bedroom and bathroom—eliminating the daily burden of climbing stairs.

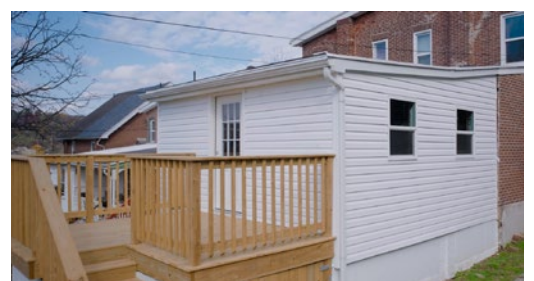
What followed was a remarkable outpouring of service and compassion.



Volunteers repaired the roof and structural damage, rebuilt exterior walls, installed new windows and doors, and completed the home with siding, gutters, and downspouts. The once-dangerous space became a beautiful, safe, and comfortable living area designed specifically to meet Jeannette's needs.

The transformation exceeded anything she imagined possible.

Through the faithful work of volunteers from local churches, businesses, and the community, Jeannette's house became more than repaired—it became a home renewed with dignity, safety, and hope.





RELATIONAL Transformation

For Kim, home had become a place of uncertainty and hardship.

The roof leaked when it rained. Floors throughout the house were collapsing. Mold had spread throughout the home, causing Kim and her grandson to be ill. Unable to work after back surgery, left her unable to work, the challenges only intensified.

Then came another painful loss—her husband Dan left.

Facing mounting repairs and overwhelming circumstances, Kim felt completely alone.

That is when Good Works stepped in.

As volunteers began restoring the home, something unexpected also began to take shape. Dan returned to help with the repairs, working alongside volunteers who served with encouragement, compassion, and care.

Little by little, while the house was being rebuilt, so was their relationship.

Day after day, the presence of people serving faithfully created space for healing, conversations, and reconciliation. What began as a project to repair a home slowly became the restoration of a marriage.

Reflecting on the experience, Dan shared: “If it wasn’t for Good Works, we couldn’t have lived here. You made our home livable. But more than that, you brought Kim and I back together. Now we know we can live here, together, the rest of our lives.”

What began as a housing crisis became a story of renewed commitment, restored hope, and the healing power of community.

Good Works did more than rebuild a house. Through faithful service and compassionate presence, a family was restored.

SPIRITUAL Transformation

When Good Works first met Bill and Desiree, they were weary, discouraged, and searching for hope.

Their home needed significant repairs, but beneath the physical struggles were even deeper burdens. Life had left both of them emotionally exhausted and spiritually empty.

As volunteers worked on the home, Good Works ambassadors spent time praying with them, reading Scripture, and encouraging them with God's Word. The Bible placed in their hands became the beginning of a much greater transformation.

The journey was not easy.

Bill battled severe depression and, at one point, attempted to take his own life. Desiree carried her own pain and struggles as well. Yet even in their darkest moments, God's presence began revealing itself through prayer, acts of kindness, and the faithful love of those serving around them.

Week after week, volunteers listened, encouraged, and shared the love of Christ.

Slowly, hearts began to soften.

Desiree became drawn to the promises found in Scripture, and before long, she and Bill began attending church together. Then came a powerful moment of transformation: Desiree gave her life to Christ and was baptized. Soon afterward, she and Bill were married in the church, celebrating not only a renewed relationship with one another, but a new life in Christ.

The atmosphere inside their home changed completely. What had once been filled with despair became a place marked by joy, peace, prayer, and laughter.

By the time the home was dedicated, one truth was unmistakably clear—the greatest transformation had not been the repairs made to the house, but the renewal of two lives.

Bill and Desiree's story is a powerful reminder that God still restores what is broken, brings light into darkness, and turns sorrow into joy through the faithful service of His people.

ROOTED IN FAITH, REACHING IN SERVICE: Neshaminy Warwick Presbyterian Church

Neshaminy Warwick Presbyterian Church (NWPC) of Warminster, PA was founded in 1726 by the Reverend William Tennent. Tennent was a graduate of the University of Edinburgh, class of 1695. After sailing to the new world in 1718, he made his way to Bucks County where he discovered enough Scotch-Irish Presbyterians to organize a congregation. Three hundred years later the church is still thriving and its members today strive to be people of hope, grounded in Biblical truth and willing to share the Good News as they serve those in need.



The NWPC Missions Group was founded in 2005 in response to Hurricane Katrina. After committing several weeks doing disaster relief in Louisiana, Alabama and North Carolina, the group sought to serve people closer to home. Peter Clayton had heard of Good Works from his son Matt who was already volunteering with the organization. Seeking to associate with a faith-based organization, Peter organized the first Good Works workday in November 2020. Today, their dedicated team of volunteers conduct six workdays annually between March and November. Dave and Darlene Baker are two of the regular volunteers and Darlene schedules the workdays for the team. “We really feel good about helping people in need”, she shared, “and we appreciate the organization and leadership of Good Works.” Good Works is pleased and honored to partner with NWPC and to celebrate their 300th anniversary in 2026.

REKINDLING A PARTNERSHIP: Good Sam & Good Works

The roots of the Church of the Good Samaritan date to 1848, when Paoli was little more than a railroad station, general store, a few cottages, and the Paoli Inn, where Sunday worship services were held. Today, “Good Sam” remains deeply committed to mission work both locally and globally. That spirit of service led to a partnership with Good Works in 2002, when Rusty Smith organized a Summer Adult Work Camp with 18 volunteers. By year’s end, Good Sam had become an official partner church with more than 35 active volunteers. For the next 15 years, Rusty led monthly workdays and cultivated a strong culture of service before stepping into a new ministry calling in 2017, after which the partnership gradually quieted as many longtime volunteers retired from active involvement. Yet, even during that quiet season, God was still at work.



In 2025, those remaining embers were reignited. The renewal began when Kate Bergmann joined the Good Works Board of Directors and reintroduced the mission to the congregation, including inviting Bob Beggs to speak at the Daughters of the King Prayer Group. At the same time, George Sheffey had been reflecting on how Good Sam could become more hands-on in serving the community. Inspired by a sermon on Matthew 6:25–34 about focusing on the needs of others, George began making calls about reconnecting with Good Works, only to discover the Holy Spirit was already moving in the hearts of others at the church. Less than three months later, the newly formed Good Sam team held its first volunteer workday, launching a renewed and growing partnership.

QUAKERTOWN CHRISTIAN SCHOOL: Learning to Serve

Quakertown Christian School is committed to equipping students to impact the world for Jesus through an exceptional, Christ-centered education. Rooted in the teachings and example of Jesus Christ, the school seeks to cultivate a culture of grace, love, service, and peacemaking while developing students into servant-leaders who use their God-given gifts to serve others and advance God’s Kingdom. The school values each child as uniquely created in God’s image and provides a safe, supportive environment where students can grow academically, spiritually, socially, and emotionally. Through excellence in academics, arts, athletics, character development, and strong partnerships with families, Quakertown Christian School intentionally prepares students to lead with humility, compassion, confidence, and purpose.

One meaningful way the school puts these values into action is through participation in the annual Good Works Work Camp each spring. During the week, students stay overnight and share meals together at Olivet United Methodist Church while spending their days repairing homes for low-income families under the guidance of the Good Works repair staff. More than just a service project, the experience gives students the opportunity to build relationships with homeowners, grow in compassion and empathy, and learn practical skills that can last a lifetime. For many students, the work camp becomes a life-changing experience that deepens both their faith and their understanding of servant leadership.

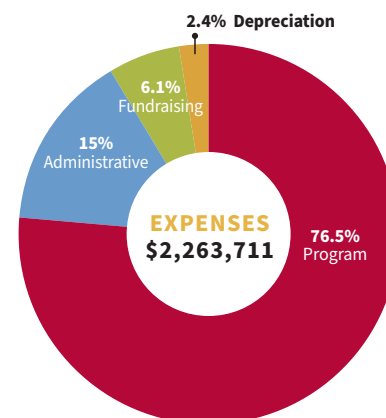
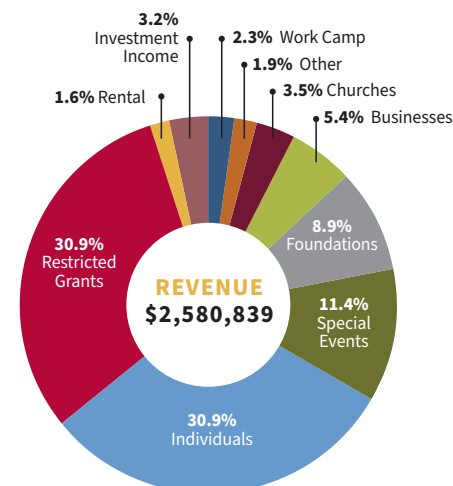
